

# Control Centre Actions, Fighting for a Fair Award

ADHSU members in Control are fighting for a fairer award, after negotiations with the Ministry of Health have stalled, members are escalating action.

Action commencing **first day shift Monday 27<sup>th</sup> of May until first night shift Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> of June.**

- No dispatching of any R7s or cases handed over by HealthShare PTS (metro) unless out of scope, end of life, hot swaps or any other case deemed necessary.

Action commenced **first day shift Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> of May - ONGOING**

- No use of CREWS – revert to paper system. Breaks and fatigue will still be monitored.
- MyShift briefings will be read, but not acknowledged. Members will still press “I do not understand” if they genuinely don’t understand and reach out for clarification as per normal procedure.
- No managing of Grade of Service by DCCO or SCCO in Control Centre. Instead, the Grade of Service will be managed by upper management.
- Ban on mandatory training. This includes Janison and MyHealth learning, however first aid is excluded.
