I am writing to advise you of proposed changes to South Western Sydney Local Health District's (SWSLHD) Executive Leadership Team and organisational structure.

The proposed changes stem from a recent review completed by the Chief Executive and the Executive Leadership Team (ELT), which resulted in a proposal for a revised structure. The revised structure will better support SWSLHD's patients, consumers, and staff and enhance the District ELT's capacity to effectively support SWSLHD strategically and operationally.

The proposed change will include the creation and renaming of directorates, realignment of teams, changes in reporting lines, regrading and updates to some position descriptions.
